
Legal Awareness Programs

Collaborating to provide financial literacy and entrepreneurship training to empower Tanzanians to develop sustainable businesses.







Re: POST REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS OPERATING IN MAINLAND TANZANIA

Reference is made to the above mentioned subject.

- In Mainland Tanzania, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) are supervise and coordinated by the National NGOs Policy, 2001 and the NGOs Act No. 24/2002 as amended by Act No. 11/2005 and Act No. 3/2019 and its regulations. In that regard,

 - a) Submit Quarterly Reports in accordance with Regulation 20 of the NGOs (Amendments) Regulations, 2019 G.N. 685.
 b) Submit Annual Activity and Audited Reports as provided by Section 29 (1) (a) and (b) of the NGOs Act No. 24/2002.

 - and (b) of the NGUS ACT NO. 24/2002.

 Pay annual subscription fees pursuant to Section 38 (2) (b) of the NGUS ACt No. 24/2002 and Regulation 6 of the NGUS (Amendments) Regulations, 2014.

 Description of the NGUS (Amendments) Regulations, 2014.

 Publish biannually in media channels which are easily accessible by the targeted beneficiaries the funds received and expenditure in accordance with Regulation 13 (a) of the NGOs (Amendments) Regulations, 2018.
 e) Submit funding contracts or agreements of funds exceeding twenty million
 - shillings to the Registrar of NGOs for approval not later than ten days from the date of entering the said contract or agreement pursuant to Regulation 13 (b) of the NGOs (Amendments) Regulations, 2018.

- f) Declare to the Registrar of NGOs any other resource received either in cash or in kind as provided by Regulation 13 (c) of the NGOs (Amendments) Regulations, 2018.

 9) Submit to the Registrar of NGOs notice of change of particulars of a registered NGO pursuant to Section 33 (1) of the NGOs Act No. 24/2002.
- It is also important to note that NGOS registered under the NGOs Act No. 24/2002 may face the following penalties for non-compliance issues:
 - a) Pay one hundred thousand Tanzanian Shillings (TZS 100,000) each year for late submission of annual activity and audited reports, as well as payment of annual subscriptions for a local NGO as per Regulation 6 of the NGOs (Amendments) Regulations, 2014.
 - Regulations, 2014.

 b) Pay three hundred American Dollars (USD 300) each year for late submission of annual activity and audited reports, as well as payment of annual subscriptions for an international NGO as provided by Regulation 6 of the NGOs (Amendments) Regulations, 2014.
 - Regulations, 2014.

 c) Pay a fine not exceeding five hundred thousand Tanzanian Shillings (TZS 500,000) or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to both such fine and imprisonment for forgery, conducting fund raising activities contrary to NGOs Act or contravening any regulation or rules made under NGOs Act as per Section 35 (1) of the NGOs Act No. 24/2002.

 d) Pay a fine not exceeding fifty thousand Tanzania Shillings (TZS 50,000) for every day during which the commission of the offence continues as may be ordered by the Court pursuant to Section 36 (2) of the NGOs Act No. 24/2002.
- 4. The submission of quarterly reports, annual reports, funding contracts, change of particulars and payment of fees are made electronically through <u>nis.jamii.go.tz</u>. The deadline for submission of annual reports and payment of annual fees is on 15th April at 3.30 pm every year.
